Industry Perceptions and Awareness

Outdated Perceptions Overshadow Agriculture Job Opportunities In a recent survey commissioned by the Canadian Agricultural Human Resource Council, 54 per cent of Canadians could not name any other occupation besides 'farmer' when asked about jobs in the agriculture sector. When asked to describe a farmer, perceptions were also outdated. According to respondents, farmers lacked diversity: 'older, man, laidback, weathered, and plaid' were common words respondents associated with their idea of the average farmer. Read more...

Control grocery prices or face new taxes, Trudeau warns chains Prime Minister Justin Trudeau has warned grocery chains that they could be hit with new taxes if they do not take steps to control rising food prices. Trudeau said the heads of the five largest supermarket chains, including Walmart and Costco, would be asked to come up with a plan to address rising prices before Thanksgiving. Trudeau, who

is <u>facing questions about his leadership</u> amid sagging public approval, also announced that sales tax would be waived for the construction of new rental apartments as part of measures to address cost-of-living concerns. <u>Read more...</u>

<u>U of G responds to demand for agricultural professionals</u> One of the most pressing issues the Canadian agriculture industry faces today is the availability of skilled labour. The agriculture and agri-food sector employs over 2.3 million Canadians, representing approximately 12 per cent of Canadian employment. The University of Guelph is responding with a hands-on, course-based program in the <u>Department of Plant Agriculture</u> offering recent graduates and professionals an upgrade to their education and training without traditional academic research. <u>Read more...</u>

Program lets adults with disabilities get their hands dirty teaching all things agriculture An employment training program that puts adults with disabilities to work in the urban agriculture and hospitality sector is looking for a new set of participants. The Orchard program, led by Hutton House in London, Ontario, helps people land a 12-week paid placement with employers in the sector. Workers learn everything from resume building to transportation training, workplace etiquette, and computer skills. They also get handson lessons about food security and how to grow food in the program funded by Service Canada. Read more...

Automation and Technology

Hybrid farm project gets \$472k in federal funding The Village Indoor Farm & Living Lab project has received \$472,560 in new federal funding through the Green and Inclusive Community Buildings program, which will enable upgrades to HVAC and electrical systems as well as windows. The indoor farm, on the

site of a former grocery store in Blacks Harbour, New Brunswick, is set to have its grand opening in October and could grow up to 8,000 pounds of food. The non-profit had supplied 17 per cent of capital costs, or \$175,000, with the municipality of Eastern Charlotte contributing \$90,000. The rest came from the green buildings fund, which is meant to support upgrades to community buildings and new builds. Read more...

<u>CowBytes software is back</u> The Beef Cattle Research Council says CowBytes is once again available. The ration-balancing software allows cattle producers to formulate their own feed rations while considering various combinations of feed and byproducts at different prices. In doing so, they can find ways to reduce feed costs while still meeting production targets. Ensuring that cattle are fed a balanced ration can also save producers on <u>feed</u> costs in the long run by preventing over- or under-feeding. <u>Read more...</u>

Farm Credit Canada and Western Fair district partner to elevate agriculture and food producers through new technology, innovation Farm Credit Canada (FCC) is engaging in a long-term partnership with Western Fair District to deliver knowledge, innovation, and research Canadian producers can use to complement their own expertise in the advancement of their farming and food businesses. The partnership announcement includes new on-farm research called Innovation Farms Ontario powered by AgExpert, located at Haggerty Creek near Bothwell, Ontario. This research farm is part of a network of Canadian demonstration farms where innovative, emerging technology is developed and tested. The results and benefits of different technologies in the emerging agriculture robotics and automation industry are shared with producers to optimize current farming practices and future decisions.
