### Industry Perceptions and Awareness

[Federal government contributing \\$11 million to new pulse crop research cluster](#). The federal government will be contributing up to \$11,017,979 to Pulse Canada for a new pulse crop research cluster under the Sustainable Canadian Agricultural Partnership, the five-year framework that started in 2023. Winnipeg South Centre MP Ben Carr announced the federal commitment at the University of Manitoba on Friday afternoon. The federal government contributed \$11.1 million to the previous pulse research cluster, which ran from 2018 to 2023 under the Canadian Agricultural Partnership's AgriScience Cluster program. [Delisle farmer recognized for promoting public trust in agriculture](#). Farm & Food Care Saskatchewan has named the recipient of the 2023 Champion Award. Shawn Colborn farms with his cousins on their fifth-generation farm near Delisle that includes 12,000 acres of grainland, a 700-head Red Angus/Charolais cow-calf enterprise and a 40,000 hen layer poultry operation. Each year, the award recognizes a recipient who has engaged consumers about agriculture, and Colborn has worked to build public trust in farming and food in the province and beyond. ### People, Wages and Workplace Culture

[Canadian farmer sentiment plummets as optimism for the coming year sours](#). In the January 2024 edition of the RealAgristudies Canadian Farmer Sentiment Index, the mood among Canada's farmers and ranchers has notably darkened, with an increased level of concern about their financial health and the overall state of the Canadian agricultural economy. According to the index, there's a significant downturn in optimism, with farmers expressing a more negative outlook on both their immediate financial situations and the broader Canadian agriculture economy. ## Immigration and Foreign Workers

[As migrant workers return, calls for improved farm, living conditions](#). With the annual return of thousands of migrant workers to Essex County greenhouses underway, the union advocating for their rights is pressing for what it sees as critically needed workplace reforms. A new report from the United Food and Commercial Workers (UFCW), Canada's largest agricultural union, flags ongoing health and safety concerns that leave migrant workers vulnerable to abuse and

exploitation. The report highlighted the dangers that migrant agricultural workers can face while in Canada, including sub-standard living conditions, chemical hazards, heat stress and more. [Read more...](#)

## Automation and Technology

[AI in food processing market projected to reach US\\$22.3B by 2032](#). According to Market.us, in 2023, the gross revenue of the 'artificial intelligence (AI) in food processing' market is projected to reach US\$11.1 billion. A thorough analysis of the AI in food processing industry forecasts that the investment could experience an annual growth rate of 8.3 per cent from 2023 to 2032. ['Animal-free' milk gets green light in Canada](#). Israeli startup Remilk, which uses the tagline "Real Dairy. No Milk," has received a 'No Objection Letter' from Health Canada. This will open the door for the use of Remilk's protein in a variety of products with the same taste and texture as milk, ice cream, yogurt, cream cheese and more. According to Remilk, its products are developed using copies of the gene responsible for the production of milk protein in cows. The gene is inserted into yeast and fermented. It multiplies rapidly and produces real milk proteins, identical to those that cows produce. [Read more...](#)
