## **Industry Perceptions and Awareness**

4-H Canada forced to lay off staff following major federal funding cut. 4-H Canada says it has had to make the difficult decision to lay off seven staff members following a major cut to the funding it receives from Agriculture and Agri-Food Canada. The move comes after 4-H Canada was informed mid-way through the fiscal 2023-24 year that its funding under the federal AgriCompetitiveness Program was approved, but at a significantly lower level than requested and past funding. 52% of farmers think securing trade agreements and market access is a win for their farm. For exportable commodities such as canola, pork, beef, seafood, and wheat, trade is a fundamental staple of creating value for products being produced by Canadian agriculture.

RealAgristudies asked Canadian farmers and ranchers about how they view certain policies impacting their operations. Twenty per cent of producers believe that trade and market access have a very positive impact and 32 per cent believe the impact is slightly positive. Read more...

College Royal returned to the University of Guelph this weekend, but this year's event was extra special: the agricultural tradition is celebrating its 100th year in the community. The school says the campus-wide open house typically attracts more than 20,000 people every year with a wide

# **Immigration and Foreign Workers**

Study: Fewer recent immigrants are seeking Canadian citizenship. A recent study by Statistics Canada has revealed that fewer recent immigrants in Canada are pursuing Canadian citizenship compared to 20+ years ago. The study, which looks longitudinally at data from 1996 to 2021, revealed that there was a nearly 30 per cent drop in citizenship rates among recent immigrants, with most of this reduction occurring in the last 10 years. The term "immigrants" is used by Statistics Canada to denote those who have received Canadian permanent residence (PR). Read more...

Half of all Canadians say there are too many immigrants: poll. High immigration levels have

traditionally enjoyed multi-partisan support in Canada, but half of all people now say that there are too many newcomers, according to a new poll. The survey conducted for the Association for Canadian Studies and the Metropolis Institute found 50 per cent of Canadians agree that there are too many immigrants coming into Canada — a number that has more than doubled since January 2023 but has remained consistent across polls conducted in the past six months. #### Once-celebrated P.E.I. apple orchard faces no sanctions despite foreign worker abuse claims.

Canadian Nectar Products is at the centre of what federal authorities allege is a web of companies defrauding the government and foreign workers. One migrant workers' advocate on the Island says the company highlights systemic issues with oversight and accountability with Canada's temporary foreign worker program. An investigation by CBC's *The Fifth Estate* has found at least 31 temporary foreign workers, out of the 217 Canadian Nectar Products and its affiliated companies were given permission to hire from 2017 to 2021, have come forward to the federal government with abuse allegations and received federal approval to be released from their work contracts as a result. # **Automation and Technology**

Deere reaches for fully autonomous fleet by 2030. As John Deere unveiled its 2025 model year product line in late February, it brought the company one year closer to a significant date: 2030. That is when the brand has promised to offer a complete fleet of autonomous equipment, able to handle a full farming season from seeding to harvest with self-driving machines. "The fully autonomous capabilities that we have available today with our 8R in tillage applications will only continue to grow and develop as we see customers trying to address that labour availability and shortage that we see in many of their operations," said Aaron Wetzel, vice-president of production systems for production and precision ag. <u>Smart tech can identify sick pigs</u>. A sick pig doesn't want anyone to know it's not well, and that can stop even the best barn staff from intervening before the animal's condition worsens. With smart technology and artificial intelligence, it should be possible to flag illness long before

humans can identify it, says Tami Brown-Brandl of the University of Nebraska, speaking at the Manitoba Swine Seminar. Brown-Brandl spoke of tech currently being used on farms such as cameras, sensors, and an analytical system that is able to spot problems before humans can. Read more...

Online mapping tool offers agricultural land use information. A new online tool allows users to examine agricultural land use across the country. Developed by ALCES for the Canadian Agri-Food Policy Institute (CAPI), the Agriculture Web Mapping Application Tool offers maps and datasets about land use, management practices, and agri-environmental indicators. Census, crop production, and land use data can be viewed individually or overlaid. Read more...

## Skill Development

S3.5M grant to help Brock research farm grow future of sustainable agriculture. Brock University's cutting-edge research that advances Canada's grape and wine industry is expanding from lab to field to other areas of agriculture thanks to a \$3.5-million grant from the Canada Foundation for Innovation (CFI). The funding supports the Clean Agriculture for Sustainable Production (CASP) Field Infrastructure project, which will include the establishment of a Brock-led research farm where scientists from Brock, other institutions, and industry will develop agricultural innovations.
