Industry Perceptions and Awareness

<u>Canadian agricultural groups draft letter asking for reversal of federal capital gains increase</u>. A group of Canadian agricultural organizations signed a letter asking the federal government to

reverse recent financial changes by the federal government. The letter looked to bring up their concerns with respect to the proposed increase to the capital gains inclusion rate, the Alternative Minimum Tax, and the Canadian Entrepreneurs' Incentive. <u>Read more...</u>

<u>Canadian farm income expected to reach new record high</u>. It appears to be a good time to be a food producer in Canada. Forecasts from Agriculture Canada suggest Canadian farm net cash income will reach a new record in 2023. They predict the difference between cash receipts and operating expenses will jump 13 per cent to a record \$24.8 billion. The beef sector is expected to see a 10 per cent increase, with crop receipts up four per cent. Expenses only increased two per cent last year, down from a 20 per cent increase in 2022. <u>Read more...</u>

Managing customer expectations as food inflation subsides. For the last two years, food inflation was considerably higher than the all-items index. As we enter 2024, Food price inflation has subsided and dropped below the all- items index. Consumers will be excited. Investors reshaped Canadian home real estate. Something similar is happening in agriculture. When asked if young, aspiring farmers ever inquired about buying his farm, Marcus Collinson just laughs. "No young farmers are buying farms," he said, adding it's why he sold his four properties southwest of London, Ont., to an investor in May and June 2020. The Toronto-based company that bought them is Bonnefield, Canada's first and largest farm real estate investment corporation. It holds more than \$1.4 billion in assets across seven provinces, representing 140,000 acres (nearly 56,656 hectares) of farmland, according to its website. <u>Read more...</u>

Immigration and Foreign Workers

Man. pork praises TFW extension. Manitoba's pork producer group is applauding a federal decision that will see a two-year permit extension for some 6,700 temporary foreign workers. The decision, announced May 8, affects mainly post-graduation work permit holders who are working in the Manitoba Skilled Worker Provincial Nominee Program Expression of Interest Pool, according to a federal news release. Their work permits would have otherwise expired this year. Read more...

For all the detail in a Senate report on Canada's temporary foreign worker program about its problems, it is very short on solutions, says P.E.I.'s Cooper Institute, which advocates for temporary foreign workers. "It's pretty frustrating," said Ryan MacRae, a program coordinator for the Charlottetown-based institute's Migrant Worker Program. "They did not address the root causes that workers face from their tied work permits and closed work permits ... They're putting more Band-Aids on bullet wounds." <u>Read more...</u>

Fruit and Vegetable Growers of Canada welcome senate report findings on temporary foreign

workers. The Fruit and Vegetable Growers of Canada (FVGC) welcomes the balanced findings of the Senate Committee on Social Affairs, Science and Technology's recent report on temporary and migrant labour solutions. The report identified six recommendations to improve Canada's temporary foreign worker (TFW) programs, emphasizing the need for an independent migrant worker commission. This commission would centralize services and address program gaps for both workers and employers, streamlining the current complex network of departments and ministries involved. <u>Read more...</u>

Automation and Technology

<u>Geothermal energy to be used to supply electricity, food</u>. A Saskatchewan company developing a project to generate electricity from geothermal heat has struck a deal with a British Columbiabased firm to build a greenhouse to take advantage of the heat. There is expanding interest in using geothermal heat to make green electricity, and by adding greenhouses to the projects, there is potential to lessen our reliance on produce imported from the United States and even more distant countries. <u>Read more...</u>

<u>Scientists on quest for drought-resistant wheat, agriculture's 'Holy Grail'</u>. Plant biologist Marcus Samuel has been working for more than a decade to improve the climate resilience of crops. At his research greenhouse at the University of Calgary, he uses cutting-edge gene editing techniques to produce hardier varieties of plants able to withstand temperature fluctuations, floods and frosts. But while he has worked on canola, peas and other crops, perhaps the most elusive and exciting part of his work is the quest for drought-resistant wheat. <u>Read more...</u>

<u>Väderstad updates Tempo line of high-speed planters</u>. Väderstad is offering updates to its line of Tempo planters, as well as a new model, available for sale in Canada starting June 1, 2024. The company says the updates enhance the precision capabilities of the Tempo, while offering farmers more choices to fit the unique needs of their operations. New to the line is the Tempo K, a 24-row planter with low-compaction tracks and 30- inch row spacing. It features a 150-bushel (5,286-litre) central fill system and optional 1,500-gallon (5,678-litre) liquid carrying capacity. Read more...

Students at one small-town school near the Alberta-Saskatchewan border are testing how the technology could be used to feed cattle. The research project at Altario school, east of Red Deer, involves growing cattle fodder in an indoor hydroponics system. <u>Read more...</u>

Grade 7 to 12 teachers and students can learn about farming in Canada through the new edition of the Real Dirt on Farming in the Classroom e-learning resource launched May 22. Developed by Agriculture in the Classroom Canada (AITC-C) and Farm & Food Care (FFC), this resource provides students the opportunity to explore key topics related to the agriculture and food industry, including the diverse individuals working in the agriculture and food industry, sustainable farming practices, the impact of climate change on agriculture, innovations in the field, and animal welfare. <u>Read more...</u>
